Take time this winter to communicate with God and those who are lonely.



For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission

I want to begin by expressing how grateful I am for being able to represent my parish and the Catholic Daughters of the Americas organization in this process of the synod. Being a part of this process has given me a greater appreciation for our Catholic faith, the hierarchy and guidance of the church officials, and the value the Holy Spirit plays in our daily lives. The process of the synod was to have purposeful and meaningful conversations concerning the definition of family and how to strengthen the faith within the family, however the family unit is defined for members of our church. The bishop was present during all discussions to better understand the suggestions given in text. Ultimately, the synod's purpose was to gather information from a variety of members of our Diocese to create a document to help the bishop prepare his declaration of how to strengthen the faith among our families. Bishop Warfel will begin to write his formal document and hopes to have his final draft ready to share with parishes by February, 2022.

As we discussed our faith and how to help educate our parishioners, I became aware of the wonderful opportunities we have to share the faith with our own families and members of our parish families with celebrations of Eucharistic Adoration, Rosaries, and adult catechesis. 1st CANDLE—(purple) THE PROPHECY CANDLE or CANDLE OF HOPE—We can have hope because God is faithful and will keep the promises made to us. Our hope comes from God. (Romans 15:12-13)

2nd CANDLE—(purple) **THE BETHLEHEM CANDLE or THE CANDLE OF PREPARATION**—God kept his promise of a Savior who would be born in Bethlehem. Preparation means to "get ready". Help us to be ready to welcome YOU, O GOD! (Luke 3:4-6)

3rd CANDLE—(pink) THE SHEPHERD CANDLE or THE CANDLE OF JOY—The angels sang a message of JOY! (Luke 2:7-15)

4th CANDLE—(purple) **THE ANGEL CANDLE or THE CANDLE OF LOVE**—The angels announced the good news of a Savior. God sent his only Son to earth to save us, because he loves us! (John 3:16-17)

1 am very honored to have this opportunity to serve the State Court and all the Courts in Montana. 1 have been a member of Court St.


